Expanding education access for girls is not just an urgent economic and social need. In many cases, it is literally a matter of life and death. A mother who can read can better protect her children from chronic illness, from AIDS, and from dying young. A child born to a mother who can read is 50 percent likely to survive past age five. In Africa's poorest nations, UNESCO projects that the lives of 1.8 Million Children could have been saved if their mothers had at least a secondary education. Education, particularly of girls and women, helps to control excessive population growth by promoting the concepts of family planning, collective health and well-being. An educated family makes informed choices with respect to having a child as well as for maintaining their own and their children's' health.

In recognition of the importance of Education for sustainable development, the United Nations General Assembly declared 2005 -2014 the **UN decade of education for sustainable development**.
